What was the impact of COVID-19 on the Cameroonian Economy?**



anticipated contraction in GDP in 2020.



forecasted economic growth for 2021.

25 basis points lowered of the interest rate in March 2020.

Cameroonian economy was strongly impacted by the combined effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, the persistence of security and political crises, and the decline in world oil prices.



SURVEYED SECTORS

Top measures taken by surveyed companies to mitigate the COVID-19 effect:



had produced a wide range of goods and services



had increased their capacity for remote working



had moved to larger premises for reasons of social distancing



Spike in the demand for labour in personal protective equipment (PPE) manufacturing, digital skills, e-commerce activities, and healthcare services in contact tracing.

surveyed individuals confirmed COVID-19 as the main cause of job loss.





reduction of employment in their enterprises since the start of COVID-19.

RECOMMENDATIONS



Skills training for **occupational health and safety** should be implemented to minimise the risks of spreading COVID among teachers, learners, and visitors in the school environment.



Entrepreneurship training is needed for informal enterprises, small enterprises in the formal sector, and for unemployed and **vulnerable groups (women and youth)**.



Employability skills to develop include critical thinking, communication, and resilience.



Assimilating the change brought about by **COVID-19** necessitates a **thorough assessment** of **skills needs** and availability in the sectors with spike in the demand due to COVID.
